21st Annual Meeting of the Society for Computers in Psychology San Francisco, California November 21, 1991

The 21st Annual Meeting of the Society for Computers in Psychology will be held at the Hyatt Regency Hotel in San Francisco on November 21, 1991, the day before the annual meeting of the Psychonomic Society. The meeting includes presentations, discussions, tutorials, and times for software and hardware demonstrations. All areas of psychology are featured, including research, education, clinical practice, and industrial applications.

Call for Papers

Papers and symposia sought for this 21st meeting include submissions in the areas of current importance to researchers such as analytical technologies, scientific visualization, and computer networks; tutorials on application software; and submissions for the Annual Student Paper Competition sponsored by the Society.

The deadline for submission is July 10, 1991.

Student Paper Competition

The Society for Computers in Psychology will continue to sponsor an award for the outstanding student paper submitted for presentation at the annual meeting. Student papers in any area of the application of Computers to psychology are welcome. Papers may be theoretical, experimental, or applied in approach. Eligibility is open to (1) work done by a student currently enrolled in undergraduate or graduate courses or (2) work done as part of a course, thesis, or other student research by a person who graduated in 1991. All papers submitted to the conference (including coauthored ones) in which the major contribution has been made by a student are eligible for the prize, and will be considered for presentation at the conference and subsequent publication in *Behavior Research Methods, Instruments, & Computers*. Student papers must include the designation "Student Award Submission" on the cover sheet. The winning paper will be presented at the 1991 conference, and the author will receive a complimentary 1-year membership in the Society, a complimentary 1-year subscription to *Behavior Research Methods, Instruments, & Computers*, and a \$200 cash prize.

The deadline for submission is July 10, 1991.
